Students also work with HD field cameras, and get an introduction to the radio booth at KDRT 95.7 FM, DMA's low-power community radio station. Clergy Statement Addressing Anti-Semitic

Fliers at U.C. Davis: Last week, fliers with an anti-Semitic message were posted throughout the UC Davis campus. UCD Chancellor Gary May responded immediately, promising an investigation and offering assurance that there is no tolerance for hate at University of California campuses. Within a day, vigils denouncing religious intolerance and hate were organized, both on campus and in Central Park. A letter will be published in The Davis Enterprise this week from members of our interfaith clergy and religious leaders. We acknowledge our religious diversity, and state our commitment to help create a society where intolerance and hatred loses its power. You'll find the signatures of all three clergy from UUCD among the names of local clergy and religious leaders. Although there was little time for widespread publicity, it was heart-warming to see members of our congregation in the gathering.
