Responsibilities

There are 7 or 8 positions in our Worship Associate program, giving each person an opportunity to present at approximately one service every two months. There are one



and two-year commitments available. If an Associate wishes to continue beyond two years, usually they're asked to wait and reapply after one year has passed. Allowing others to experience this unique relationship with the congregation is a strength of the program.

The Worship Associate is part of a larger team and each Associate works with support. Approximately one month prior to the Associate's chosen Sunday, the Worship Associate and Minister discuss the direction and message of the service.

In September, we'll continue to worship online, and we intend to transition to some version of in-person worship mid-year. The timing for the transition and our worship style can't be predicted! Whether the services are on-line or in-person, the Associate will have an important role in worship. During the second year, an Associate may be responsible for cooperatively creating an entire service for a guest speaker, or giving the main message.

Who Is Considered?

- Those who are representative of the diversity of this congregation.
- Those who work well as a team because everything about worship is teamwork.
- Those who are excited about engaging in ongoing reflection and dialogue.
- Those who are interested in learning the dynamics of worship.
- Those who see worship as their spiritual practice.
- Those who want to practice seeing life through the lens of Unitarian Universalism.

To Whom Are Associates Accountable?

The Associates are most directly accountable to Senior Minister, Rev. Elizabeth Banks. Ultimately, they are accountable to the membership of the congregation.

The congregation is invited to direct comments concerning services to the Associates or to the Senior Minister. We are interested in learning through dialogue.

Mandatory Training Sessions

Training is worshipful, educational, interactive, and reflective, with opportunities to write and share our work in a supportive environment.

During our sessions, we have worked with seminary faculty, writing coaches, voice instructors, published poets, dance leaders and improv facilitators.

Throughout the year Associates continue to gain skill and insight as worship leaders.
